



# Chapter & Verse

A hands-on turning session begins at the March meeting at the woodshop at the Miller School near Batesville in Albemarle County.

The Central Virginia Woodturners will then gather every third month at the shop. The turning meetings will run from 6:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m.

The plan approved by the membership at the January meeting includes plans for advanced turners to work with small group of novices. Peter Welch, woodshop instructor at Miller and newsletter editor, is coordinating the initiative.

Additional details will be discussed at the February meeting at the Artisans Center of Virginia.

Also approved were plans to schedule all-day demonstrations in late February and March with Bob Rosand and Mark St. Leger, both well-known demonstrators.

Highlight of the February meeting will be at least four different demonstrations. Scott Koehn,

chapter treasurer, volunteered to coordinate the event. Scott solicited suggestions from the membership on what topics members wanted included.

Ray Tilghman, librarian, announced that the two compact disc set containing the index for all back issues of the American Association of Woodturners (AAW) magazine was now available. The index for the American Woodturner was the first of a series of library purchases approved at the December meeting. Ray expects the money allocated will cover eight or so books and videotapes.

Fred Williamson, chapter member and a professional turner, led the January demo as members used patterns to bandsaw various sizes of wooden calipers and assemble them. Fred provided all of the wood and materials for the project, which was enthusiastically received. The calipers

are used to measure and insure a consistent wall thickness in bowl turning.

Other items discussed included:

\*\*\*\*Methods to arrange for turning demos in area schools to promote woodturning.

\*\*\*\*Approval of \$75 payment to join the Artisans Center for the upcoming year. The fee covers use of the center's space for monthly meetings.

The show and tell session featured a good selection of turnings. It led to discussion of several techniques and topics. The silent auction continued to attract a crowd as members bid on wood pieces. All members are invited to bring items for show and tell and the silent auction.

## Treasurer's Report

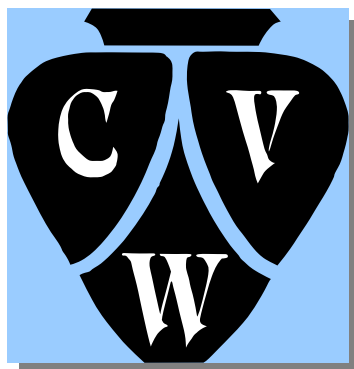
And other info you should know.
